In 2018, Quincy's parents received devastating news: Their son had a tumor on his right kidney and needed to go to St. Jude Children's Research Hospital®. But the moment Quincy's family arrived at St. Jude, they felt hope. "As soon as we walked in, the staff was ready for us," his mom said. "I was no longer afraid of anything." At St. Jude, tests showed Quincy had a type of kidney cancer called Wilms tumor. His treatment included surgery to remove the affected kidney, followed by chemotherapy. Quincy often asked his care team questions about his treatment. "His nurses made it a learning experience for Quincy. He took ownership of what was happening to him," his mom said. "And that really helps you as a parent watching your child going through something like this." Quincy finished treatment in August 2018 and visits St. Jude for regular checkups. He's a smart, wildly imaginative boy who loves spending time with his family.
